God has a sense of humour because I distinctly remember my disappointment at having to leave the University of Life when I was about to enter the year 5 classroom. Today, I am the year 5 teacher in that exact room! I feel so blessed to have this opportunity and responsibility.

The University of Life forms character and cultivates Christian values. We want to nurture not just good students but good people. One example of change happened recently in my classroom. A boy was sharing about his birthday and explained that someone had broken an egg on his head as a joke (saying it was a birthday tradition), but that he hadn't liked it. We discussed this and agreed that it was not very nice behaviour. Two weeks later another boy in the class came to me and confessed that he had broken the egg and had been feeling convicted about it. He apologised and I thanked him for asking for forgiveness. As we study respect and responsibility as one of our topics this month, it was a very real example of how our students are developing values for their lives.

I am delighted to be working here. I love the team of staff, and I have lots of ideas. You can count on me!
